

Significant Investments Are Celebrated at St. Peter's College

Approximately 100 people gathered at a reception at St. Peter's College in Muenster on September 20th, 2007 to recognize the significant contributions by founding families of St. Peter's Colony.



The Dauk, Gerwing, Novecosky and Weber Families have generously donated more than \$150,000 to St. Peter's College. The donations were used in support of renovations to the college, new technology and program enhancements.

These contributions were commemorated with the unveiling of stained glass windows symbolizing the history of each of these families.
