The Business Administration Certificate for International Students (IBAC) is for people who:

- are international students who want to study Business / Commerce in Canada.
- academically qualify to enter Canadian Universities, but do not meet the necessary English language requirements.
- want education that can transition into a Bachelor of Commerce degree program.
- would like a career in Business / Commerce.

The International Business Administration Certificate Program allows you to:

- study business at the Edwards School of Business, University of Saskatchewan.
- receive conditional acceptance into the Bachelor of Commerce Degree Program at the Edwards School of Business.
- be immersed in business-oriented English as a Second Language (ESL) programming and complete first-year university business courses.



Study Business in Canada...


Students who are admitted to the IBAC program will also be conditionally admitted to the ESB Bachelor of Commerce Program. Once students successfully complete IBAC, they can transfer into the Bachelor of Commerce Program with 45 of the 120 credits required for the Bachelor of Commerce Degree.

Upon successful completion of the IBAC program, students will be granted an International Business Administration Certificate from the Edwards School of Business.



IBAC students will spend the first year of the program at St. Peter's College in Muenster, Saskatchewan where you will:

- be immersed in English as a Second Language Programming.
- develop your English language skills.
- participate in many fun activities that will help you to become fluent in the English language.
- learn English language skills and gain business experience from work placements.
- write an English language proficiency exam.

IBAC Program Overview

Students are conditionally admitted for Terms 1, 2, and 3 at St. Peter's College in Muenster, Saskatchewan. St. Peter's College is located approximately 1 hour away from the main University of Saskatchewan campus.

Terms 4 and 5 will be completed at the Edwards School of Business, University of Saskatchewan. Conditions of admission will be lifted upon successful completion of TOEFL admission requirements.

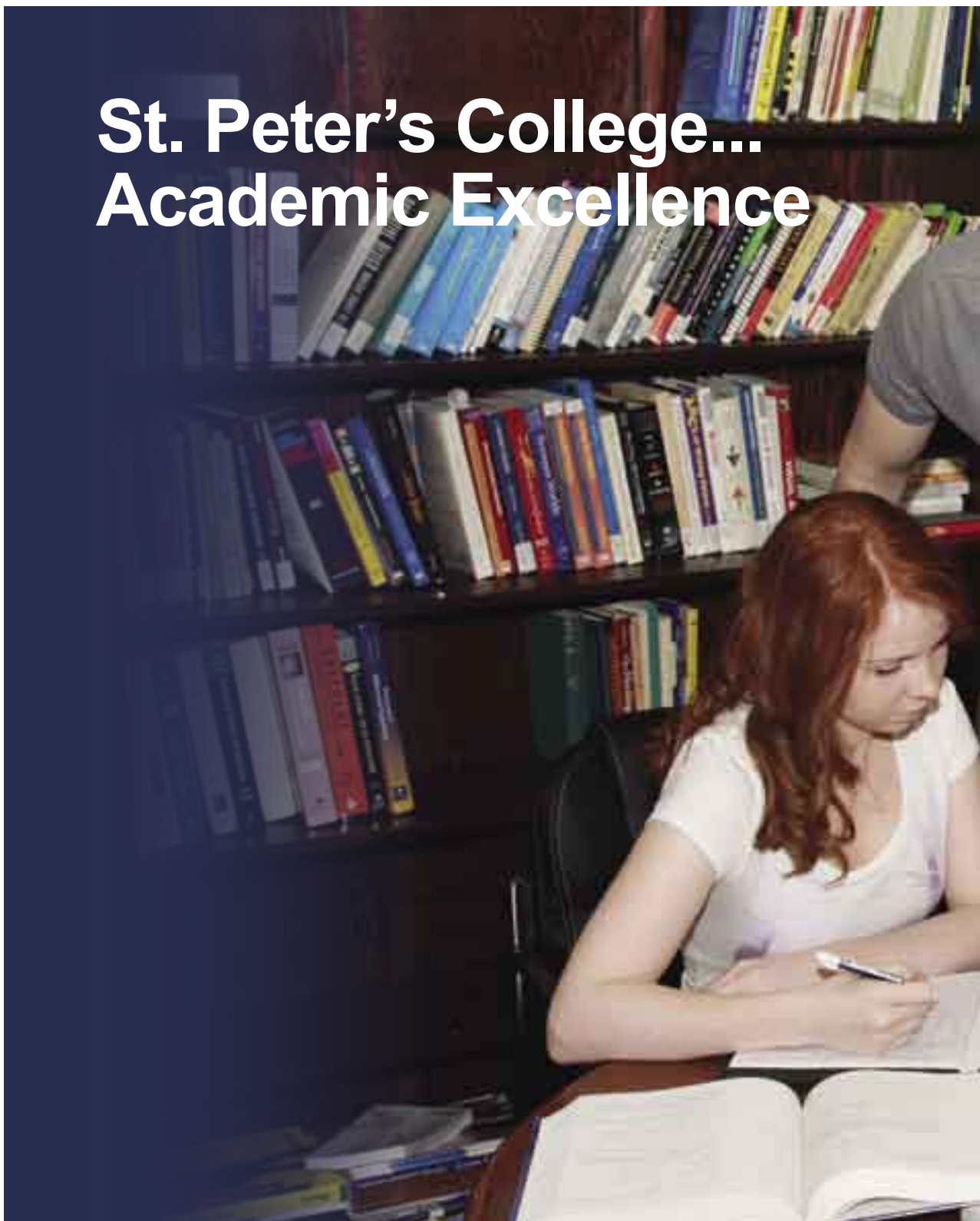

The Severin Hall offers double occupancy rooms with private bathroom. Rooms and roommates will be assigned. Severin Hall also has shared kitchen and recreation facilities. 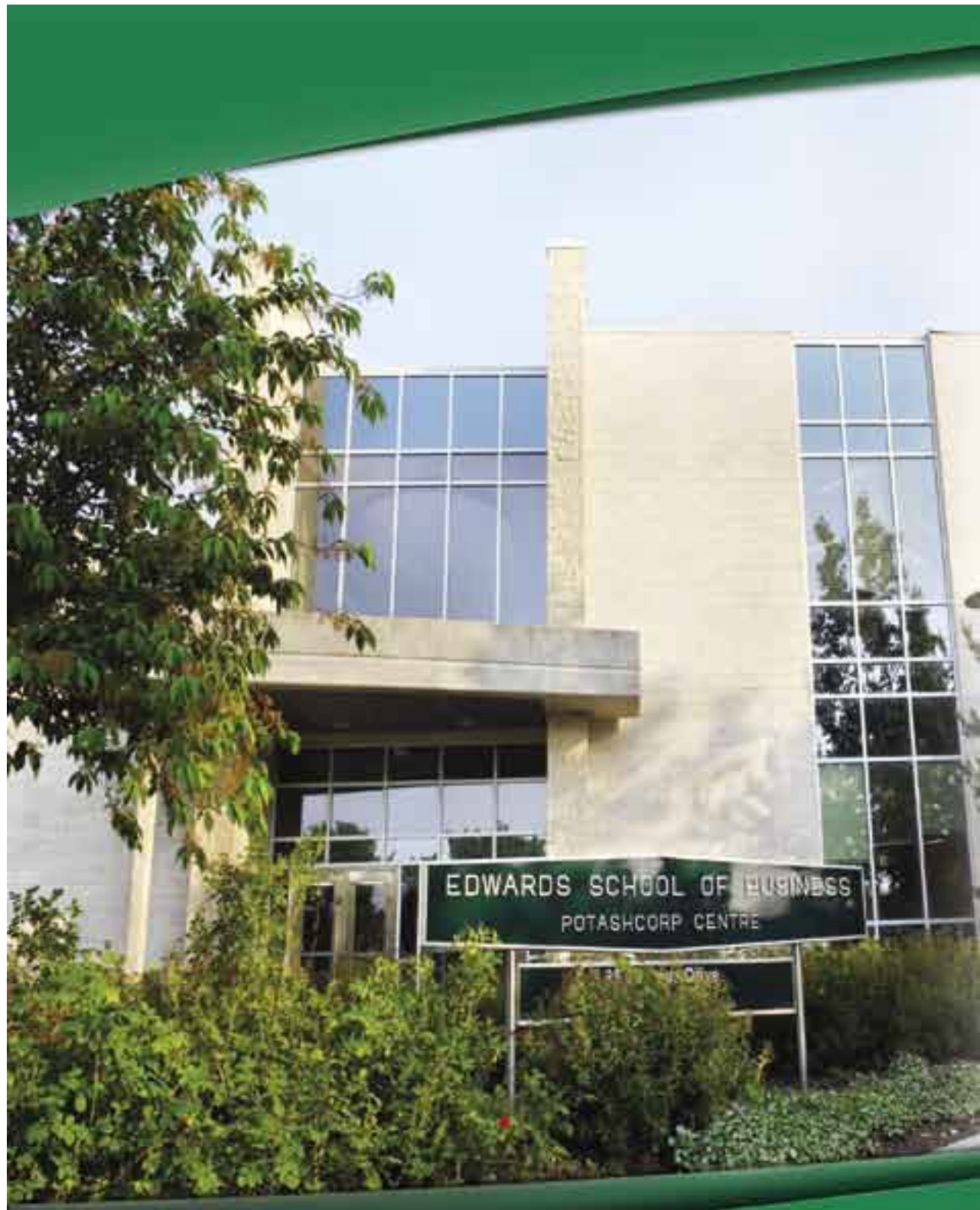

Application to the IBAC Program involves applying to both the University of Saskatchewan & St. Peter's College.
Deadline to apply is May 1st.

1. Students must fulfil the academic entry requirements of the University of Saskatchewan; however, the IBAC program allows students to apply without currently meeting the English language proficiency requirements.
2. Contact St. Peter's College to inform of your decision to apply to the International Business Administration Program at:

3. Submit your application the University of Saskatchewan before May 1st. Complete your application form online at:
<http://www.explore.usask.ca/admission>
4. Click on: "Apply for Admission" and then create Login.
5. Select "International High School Admission."
6. Complete the online application form. Be sure to include an email address that you check frequently.
7. For Program Choice, choose Edwards School of Business - Bachelor of Commerce.
8. Indicate that you wish to study IBAC at St. Peter's College. Type in "St. Peter's College - IBAC" in campus selection.
9. Note: Be sure to complete the English language proficiency section, even if you do not meet the entrance requirements for the University of Saskatchewan.
10. Pay the \$90 CDN application fee. This may be done with a credit card online.
11. Once your application has been received, you will be contacted by e-mail with a list of documents and other information you will need to submit to the University of Saskatchewan.
12. Apply to the Government of Canada for a study permit. Please see the following website: <http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/study/index.asp>.
13. Documents must be submitted to the University of Saskatchewan by June 1st.
14. If the Edwards School of Business offers you admittance into the IBAC program, you must apply St. Peter's College to reserve your seat. There are limited seats available.
